◆ TO DEVELOP THE DESIRED ATTITUDES ON THE PART OF THE STUDENTS (OPEN-MINDEDNESS AND TOLERANCE TOWARDS OTHER PEOPLE)

 TO TEACH THEM WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A RESPONSIBLE AND ETHICAL CITIZEN

The teachers raise students' citizenship awareness:

- by including "hot" social issues in the syllabuses of such subjects as Social Sciences, Civic Education, History, Polish or English
- by involving students in intercultural and international projects
- by encouraging students to participate in local projects and workshops against discrimination, etc.



- Meetings with the people who survived the concentration camps and Siberia during WWII,
- "My Family" students discover the facts about the past of their families to build their identity
